Sally Ranney is President of the American Renewable Energy Institute (AREI), Co-Director of the international Women's Earth and Climate Initiative, CEO of Stillwater Preservation, LLC, a wetlands mitigation banking company, founder/President of Rising Wolf Int'l, and co-founder/Anchor of A Matter of Degree, an internet program specializing in climate change as related to a variety of topics ranging from business and renewable energy, to food systems and weather.

With 30 years experience in the public/private sectors in biodiversity, energy, water, wildlife, climate change and public land policy, Ranney's achievements include developing 'Corridors of Life', the first, large GIS satellite land-mapping program undertaken by an NGO in the U.S. She founded American Wildlands, was appointed by President Reagan to the Commission on American Outdoors, serves on the BOD of the Gallmann African Conservancy (US/Kenya) and chairs the eraGlobal Alliance. She is a Patron of Nature of IUCN, on the Global Advisory Committee of Women & the Green Economy (WAGE) and on the advisory board of Round Rock Partners, LLC. Sally served on the BOD of the Natural Resource & Agricultural Policy Advisory Board, Colorado State University and The Natural Step. The recipient of several awards, including the Horace Albright Award and the International Conservation Award, she was selected to be a TED speaker at TEDx Denver in 2011 and featured at the Biannual of the Americas.
